How do I pay for Hospice Care?

Most hospice patients do not have any out of pocket expenses. Oftentimes, hospice Care is covered by Medicare and other insurance plans. We will walk you through the process to get the care approved.

No. Hospice is a level and form of care that is provided in the place the patient calls home. Options include nursing homes, hospitals, or in the patient's home.
